

Max Potential coaches connect: Youth program participants define success over dinner

This was the second time the Coaches Connect Dinner had been held at the Club with the aim of enhancing the knowledge of the coaches in attendance. The dinner is also a way for coaches to catch up with each other and past coaches and to receive information on the latest research on personal leadership development.

Max Potential will continue in Mudgee until August 1 when the program will hold their annual showcase and presentation afternoon.
